The Southgate Recreation and Park District Vineyard Springs park improvement development impact fee was established to finance basic park improvements, a portion of a community center, tot lots and recreational fields and miscellaneous structures, and open space & trail facilities in the Vineyard Financing Plan area that is within the Vineyard Springs Comprehensive Plan area.
